Article 1 Organisation

- 1.1 Rally Tasmania will be a Motorsport Australia State Championship Special Stage Rally, held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, the National Rally Code (NRC), the Tasmanian Rally Championship (TRC) Sporting Regulations, these Event Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations or Bulletins issued.

The Rally will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au

- 1.2 The Motorsport Australia Permit Number authorising the Event is 720/0711/01
- 1.3 The organiser and promoter of the Rally Tasmania will be the Rally Tasmania with the Event to take place on Saturday, 7th November 2020

Article 2 Rally Eligibility and Description

- 2.1 The Rally Tasmania counts towards the following series:
- 2020 Tasmanian Rally Championship
 - 2020 Buckby Subaru Challenge
- 2.2 The total length of the Rally will be approximately TBC kms including 10 Special Stages
The competitive length of the Rally will be approximately TBC kms
- 2.3 The Rally will consist of two heats on the one day. Competition in the second heat will be conditional on the vehicle having started in the first Heat but not necessarily finishing that heat.
- 2.4 The Start of the Rally will be at 1000 hrs on Saturday, 7th November 2020 from TCO (the Out Control) at the Lebrinna Hall. Each Crew must report to this control in accordance with the Official Start List.

Article 3 Competitors, Entry Form, Entries and Entry Fee

- 3.1 Each crew member will be required to complete a Motorsport Australia Dual Occupant Vehicle Declaration, and to update the declaration daily should the need arise [Declaration Form HERE](#)
- 3.2 Crew to have sanitation requirements available for their personal hygiene – such as hand sanitiser for frequent use during the event and are required to regularly clean the vehicle especially the common contact surfaces.
- 3.3 The Entry Fee for the Rally Tasmania will be \$425 for Early Entries and \$495 for Late Entries

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- 3.4 \$50 fee will be deducted from entry fee refund for withdrawing after close of entries. There will be no entry fee refund for withdrawing after the publication of the seeded entry list.
- 3.5 Each Competitor (entrant) must ensure compliance with the NCR in regard to their entry to the Rally.

Article 4 Reconnaissance

- 4.1 Competitors will be sent a PDF version of the road book upon acceptance of their entry, but not closer than two (2) weeks prior to the event.
- 4.2 Reconnaissance may be conducted by crews at any time after receipt of their roadbook from the event. **It is imperative that crews follow any instruction of signage as posted by forestry contractors at forestry sites.** Failure to comply with forest contractors instructions will result in penalties up to exclusion from the event.
- 4.3 It is recommended that reconnaissance participants carry an 80 channel UHF for communication with any forest contractors that may be operating on the planned date for reconnaissance. UHF radios are available from the Clerk of the Course if required.
- 4.4 Crews will only be permitted to complete two (2) reconnaissance runs over the course. Any crew found to have completed more than their requisite two reconnaissance runs will be referred to the Stewards.
- 4.5 The maximum speed limit applicable on all special stages and other unsealed roads during reconnaissance shall be 60kmh and all crews are required to strictly adhere to this limit. The speed of the vehicles being used for reconnaissance may be monitored by Officials using Speed Cameras and Radar guns.
- 4.6 During reconnaissance, roads WILL NOT be closed and crews are advised that they DO NOT have priority over other road users. Members of the public may also be using these roads and may be travelling in opposing directions.
- 4.7 Crews are also reminded that the Road Traffic Act will remain in effect for the duration of reconnaissance and that all road laws must be observed (e.g. complying with advisory signs, obeying speed limits imposed and keeping to the left). Officials will be on course to monitor crew compliance with these laws and regulations.
- 4.8 The organisers may specify further conditions for reconnaissance in a Bulletin, including specific times for reconnaissance of stages.
- 4.9 Reconnaissance may be carried out in any road-registered vehicle. Advertising, underbody protection, safety equipment and internal navigational aids are permitted. The tyres to be used are to have a maximum groove width and depth of 8mm and no other opening in the tread may be greater than 12mm (worn rally tyres are not to be used). Tyres marked M+S having a non-aggressive tread pattern may be used, but only after a written application by a competitor has been approved by the Clerk of Course or their representative.

Article 5 Documentation, Scrutiny and Briefings

- 5.1 The TRC Sporting Regulations, Article 12.3 and Article 14.2 are changed by these supplementary regulations as follows:
- 5.2 Documentation will be checked online once the electronic entries have been received and completed in full. Vehicle log books can be presented for signing by pre-arrangement, organised by the competitor by a local bronze level scrutineer. This can only be completed once the Self Scrutiny Declaration has been completed and viewed by the scrutineer.
- 5.3 Competitors are required to complete Motorsport Australia Self Scrutiny Declaration and Checklist, which must be returned to the organisers prior to close of entries. Apparel can be viewed on the day by the chief scrutineer. Any vehicle damage reports are to be submitted to the Clerk of the Course with post-event paperwork.
- 5.5 Briefing documents will be circulated to all competitors electronically and acknowledgement of receipt of these will be required by the Event Secretary prior to the close of entries (1/11). Confirmation can be submitted in the form or email or SMS.

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Article 6 Servicing

6.1 Remote Service Zones will not be used.

Article 7 COVID-19

This event will be conducted in conjunction with the requirements of the Motorsport Australia COVID-19 Return to Race Strategy and any conditions or requirements as set by the TAS Government. All participants and attendees at this event will have their details recorded in an Event Attendance Register. Should any requirements change as result of any COVID-19 conditions applied by TAS Government it will be advised via Further Regulations or Event Bulletin. Attendance by any person at this event is subject to that person acknowledging that they:

- have not been diagnosed with COVID-19 as confirmed with a positive test for COVID-19 (not antibody test);
 - are not currently experiencing any symptoms of COVID-19;
 - have not been in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days;
 - have not been overseas or have been in contact with someone who has been overseas in the previous 14 days;
- and
- have not been in any area or location that has a travel restriction applied due to COVID-19 in the previous 14 days, except where an exemption is applicable as determined by the relevant Government authority.

7.1 Drivers and Pit crew are encouraged to download the COVIDSafe App.

Competitors are reminded of the following COVID Safe Items:

- Stay at home if you have any cold or flu symptoms.
- Maintain social distancing measure 1.5 metres.
- Do not gather in groups. Wash your hands frequently. Dispose of any paper towels that you have used in the bin.
- Sanitizer is provided at Rally HQ. Please use it regularly.
- If you develop symptoms while at the event, you must immediately isolate from everyone other than immediate family, inform the Covid-19 officer, pack up and leave.

7.2 Restrictions

Under no circumstances should anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 attend the event. This includes any fever, respiratory symptoms, shortness of breath, sore throat, cough, fatigue, or lack of sense of smell.

Under no circumstances should anyone attend the event if they have been:

- i. overseas in the previous 14 days: or
- ii. in contact with someone who has been overseas in the previous 14 days: or
- iii. in contact with a known COVID-19 positive case in the previous 14 days
